

This garment is fitted with impact protectors for the knees. Pockets are provided at the hips for fitting aftermarket impact protectors. Replacing the knee armour with higher performing impact protectors and adding hip impact protectors would improve the protection levels of this garment. There are no vents to allow airflow movement through the garment.
